

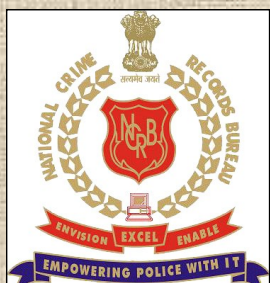

### From the Desk of DG, NCRB

I take this opportunity to wish all the officers and staff members of NCRB for putting their best efforts to move forward towards our desired goal. The review meeting on pendency of work has reduced the pendency of various sections especially, Central Finger Print Bureau (CFPB) and improved the efficiency of output. Crime in India (2009) & Accidental Death and Suicides in India (2009) and Finger Print in India have been published by NCRB which will be of great use to all the stake holders apart from assisting the policy makers. Work on publishing Crime in India 2010 and Accidental Death & Suicides in India 2010 is going on full swing and we are expected to bring out these 2 editions shortly. We are also planning to upgrade the existing CFPB with more manpower and advanced technology in the form of Automated Multi-model Bio-metric System (AMBIS). If it is implemented it will go a long way to improve the efficiency of the Police force in India. The Training section of NCRB has already conducted the Training of Trainers course on CCTNS. The Ministry of External Affairs (MEA) has allotted 4 more courses for foreign police officers on “Advanced Programme in Computer Networking and Security for IT Personnel in Police” and “Advanced Finger Print Science for Fingerprint Experts”. The next course is going to start in the months of October 2011. This will help the foreign police officers as well as the officers of NCRB to share their knowledge and skills for betterment of the global society. All the nodal officers of CCTNS of all the States/UTs had been invited to Delhi for meeting and the developments taking place in CCTNS project were shared between the states/UTs officers. We have also issued guidelines regarding System Integrator Request for proposal, so that the States/UTs are able to finalise the system integrators and the hardware and networking problems which may arise during the implementation stage of CCTNS in the States/UTs can be efficiently tackled by the States/UTs.

Finally, with profound grief I express my heart felt condolence to the sad and untimely demise of Shri Ajay Gadkary, Inspector (FP) of Central Finger Print Bureau, NCR. He was a very efficient, dedicated and hardworking officer of CFPB. His untimely demise has given us a shock and it will take long time for us to recover from this huge lose. I convey my condolence to his wife and children and assure them that we are with them in this sad moment and in future as one of the family members.

A Special TOT programme was organized at NEPA ,Meghalaya from 21st February 2011 to 26th February 2011. 41 Police officers were attended from all the North Eastern States except Sikkim.

### **Latest Success Story of CFPB**

Smt. Anupama Gulati was brutally murdered and the mutilated body (severed into 72 parts) was stuffed inside a deep freezer in her own residence in Dehradun, Uttarakhand. The police were able to lift some fragmented chance prints left on the surface of the dagger, suspected to have been used in hacking the body. These chance prints were sent to CFPB by the Honorable Chief Judicial Magistrate, Dehradun, Uttarakhand on 22-12-2010 for examination and expert opinion thereon (FIR No. 201/2010 u/s 302/201 IPC PS. Cantt, Dehradun). On initial examination at CFPB, the prints which were overlapping, were found to be extremely hazy. To exacerbate the problem, they were partial as well. Nevertheless, on detail scrutiny, a few prints could be pin-pointed and sent for photography in the photo lab of the Bureau. There also, initially, proper images were hard to develop but after repeated attempts 2 (two) chance prints were developed into photographs which, on examination, were found to be identical with the thumb and middle finger of the right hand of Sh. Rajesh Gulati, her own husband, thereby making the case water tight for the investigators. As a result, a macabre crime which shocked the entire nation was solved in quick time which reinforces the theory of infallibility of fingerprint science. The case also highlights the working in tandem of different agencies.

## हमारा प्रयास-हिन्दी का विकास

राजभाषा हिंदी के प्रचार-प्रसार एवं शासकीय कार्य में हिंदी के प्रयोग को बढ़ावा देने के लिए दिनांक 21.06.2011 को केन्द्रीय विद्युत प्राधिकरण के सम्मेलन कक्ष में महानिदेशक राष्ट्रीय अपराध रिकार्ड ब्यूरो की अध्यक्षता में नगर राजभाषा कार्यान्वयन समिति की प्रथम बैठक का आयोजन किया गया। इसमें मुख्य अतिथि के रूप में सचिव, राजभाषा को आमंत्रित किया गया था। इस बैठक में महानिदेशक, राष्ट्रीय अपराध रिकार्ड ब्यूरो, सचिव राजभाषा, उपनिदेशक(एफ.आर.एस.टी.), राष्ट्रीय अपराध रिकार्ड ब्यूरो ने अपने बहुमूल्य सुझावों एवं अनुभवों से समिति के सदस्यों का मार्गदर्शन किया तथा शासकीय कार्य में सरल हिंदी का प्रयोग करने हेतु प्रोत्साहित किया।

## Talaash Success Stories

### दिल्ली से गुमशुदा 25 वर्षीय सुमित की लावारिस लाश मुजफ्फर नगर, उत्तरप्रदेश में मिली।

दिनांक 27 जनवरी 2011 को थाना मंसूरपुर (जिला व प्रदेश का उल्लेख नहीं था) एक अज्ञात लाश पाए जाने संबंधी इशतहार की फोटो कापी प्राप्त हुई जिसमें मृतक का चेहरा स्पष्ट नहीं दिख रहा था। परन्तु इशतहार में मृतक व्यक्ति के संबंध में विस्तृत जानकारी दी गई थी जिसमें सबसे महत्वपूर्ण था मृतक द्वारा दाँए हाथ में पहना एक फाइबर का ब्रेसलेट जिस पर सुमित नाम लिखा था। मृतक की उम्र करीब 25 वर्ष, स्वस्थ शरीर व ऊँचाई लगभग 5 फुट 11 इंच बताई गई थी।

दिल्ली व अन्य पड़ोसी राज्यों की गुमशुदा व्यक्तियों की सूचनाओं का बारीकी से चैक किया गया परन्तु इस नाम व उम्र का कोई व्यक्ति गुम नहीं मिला। राष्ट्रीय अपराध रिकार्ड ब्यूरो में अन्वेषण कर्ताओं ने हार न मानते हुए सुमित नाम को ध्यान में रखते हुए रोज प्राप्त होने वाली गुमशुदा व्यक्तियों की रिपोर्ट पर विशेष ध्यान देना शुरू किया। दिनांक 2 फरवरी 2011 को दिल्ली के वैलकम थाने से एक युवक सुमित @ बालू उम्र 28 वर्ष के गुम होने को सूचना प्राप्त होने से उम्मीद की किरण दिखाई दी हालांकि गुमशुदा व्यक्ति के कपड़े व मृतक के कपड़ों में बड़ा अंतर था। फोटो, कद, काठी, उम्र आदि को ध्यान से विश्लेषित कर गुमशुदा के परिजनों से संपर्क किया तो पूछताछ से इस बात की पुष्टि हो गई कि मृतक व्यक्ति ही गुमशुदा सुमित है जिसकी मंसूरपुर, जिला मुजफ्फर नगर, उत्तरप्रदेश ले जाकर हत्या कर दी गई थी।

### 72 वर्षीय आनंद मोहन की शिनाख्त

थाना हजरत निजामुद्दीन रेलवे, दिल्ली से एक सूचना प्राप्त हुई कि दिनांक 21/11/2010 को एक 70-75 वर्षीय बुजुर्ग की रेल दुर्घटना में मौत हो गई है जो आसमानी रंग की शर्ट व नीली पैन्ट पहने हैं। मृत व्यक्ति के सिर्फ चेहरे का चित्र संलग्न था।

दिनांक 2 फरवरी 2010 को इस कार्यालय को थाना न्यू फ्रेन्ड्स कालोनी से सूचना प्राप्त हुई कि एक 72 वर्षीय बुजुर्ग श्री आनंद मोहन जी दिनांक 23/11/2010 से लापता हैं। जो सफेद कमीज व भूरी पैन्ट पहने हैं।

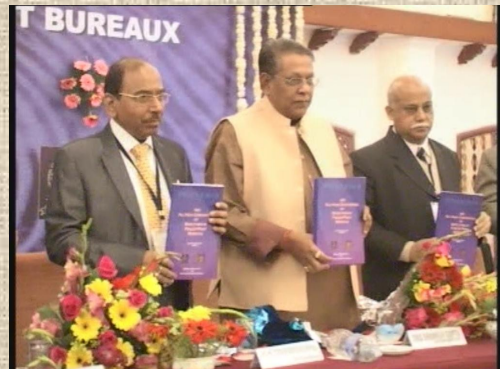
दोनों सूचनाओं की बात यह मृत व्यक्ति व गुमशुदा व्यक्ति के कपड़े पूर्णतः भिन्न थे। आश्चर्यजनक बात यह है कि उस व्यक्ति की गुमशुदगी 23/11/2000 की बताई गई है जबकि 29/11/2010 को लावारिस शव मिल चुका है। जाँच का दायरा सिर्फ तिथि तक सीमित न रखते हुए मृत व्यक्ति के चेहरे की कुछ विशेषताओं को ध्यान में रखते हुए अधिकारियों के साथ गहन विश्लेषण किया गया। जब टीम के सदस्यों ने मिलान को अंतिम रूप दिया तब गुमशुदा के परिजनों से संपर्क किया तो इस बात की पुष्टि हो गई कि मृत व्यक्ति ही गुमशुदा आनंद मोहन है।

### **The XIII All India Conference of Directors of Finger Prints Bureaux**



The XIII All India Conference of Directors of Finger Prints Bureaux of States/UTs was held on 6<sup>th</sup> & 7<sup>th</sup> January 2011 at Bhopal, Madhya Pradesh under the Chairmanship of Shri N.K. Tripathi, Director General, National Crime Records Bureau, New Delhi. A total of 38 delegates from States, Union Territories and from other Departments attended the conference besides the officials from NCRB and host state of Madhya Pradesh. Shri Uma Shankar Gupta, Hon'ble Minister for Home, Government of Madhya Pradesh, inaugurated the Conference. The Conference extensively

deliberated over several issues faced by the Finger Bureaux of the country. The discussions inter-alia covered burning issues like Inter State Connectivity of AFIS, Benchmarking of AFIS, CCTNS, Modernisation in Finger Print Science, Training of Finger Print Experts in modern techniques, legal issues pertaining to Finger Prints, Universal Registration of Finger Prints, status of Finger Print Experts etc.



## Miscellaneous activities in NCRB

### NCRB Website Updated



Website for NCRB <http://ncrb.gov.in> is being updated on regular basis with regards to the information related to CCIS, Motor Vehicle Co-ordination system and Crime and Criminal Tracking Network & Systems (CCTNS). This Bureau has tried to give a new look to Hindi sites of NCRB.

Software for Network Connectivity for CCTNS Project has been uploaded on NCRB website to facilitate States/UTs users to upload their network related information directly on NCRB website. A login procedure for the same has been circulated to concerned users.

Since August 2010 till June 2011, the website has registered over 2,90,000 hits, which is a sure indicator of its increasing popularity.

### DATA CENTER

To ensure the timely availability of various web-enabled applications like Crime Criminal Information System, Motor Vehicle Etc. and Active Site (Primary Site) has been established at NCRB and a Disaster Recovery Site (Secondary Site) has been established at NIC, New Delhi. Homepage has been re-designed for better look. Various important information like MHA/CPOs/SCRxBx chief name along with their official address and contacts details have been posted on this Homepage. The uploaded information is updated regularly. This can be accessed only by internal users on Local Area Network.

### CCTNS Progress Report - Milestones



A workshop was organized for review of 7 Integrated Investigation Forms (IIFs). Few modifications were suggested in the already existing IIFs and four new IIF's were designed. They are 1. Missing Person Registration 2. Registration of Unnatural Deaths 3. Registration of Unidentified Dead Bodies 4. Unidentified Persons.

A workshop was organized to seek inputs for the design of Juvenile Module for CCTNS project in accordance with the Juvenile Justice Act.

The CAS Core Group Meeting was held on 17<sup>th</sup> and 18<sup>th</sup> of Feb, 2011 to review and provide recommendations on the deliverables of Software Development Agency (SDA) for design, development and maintenance of Core Application Software (CAS) of the CCTNS project. The CAS Core Group has recommended that CAS (centre) will have bilingual capability in English and Hindi and data entry and search facility can be done in English.

CCTNS shall have interfaces with External Agencies/Mission-Mode-Projects (MMPs) like Passport Seva Project (PSP), Immigration, Visa and Foreigners Registration & Tracking (IVFRT), e-Courts, Transport MMP etc. Officers in the CCTNS project are working towards this goal.

CCTNS Nodal Officers of States/UTs workshop was held on 9<sup>th</sup> March, 2011.

The review comments from states/UTs on the System Requirement Specifications (SRS) delivered by Software Development Agency (SDA) have been incorporated and SRS version 8.0 has been submitted by SDA to NCRB for approval.

NCRB is in the process of printing CCTNS Pamphlets/Posters to popularize CCTNS for creating awareness among police personnel and citizens regarding the project. NCRB is also in the process of creating an interactive Video to create awareness on the CCTNS application.

NCRB had evaluated the Project Implementation Reports (PIM Reports) received from all 35 States/ UTs and sent its recommendations regarding budget allocation and additional requirements from States/UTs to MHA. MHA had conducted an independent evaluation again based on the fund allocations proposed in the State plans, the Cabinet Committee of Economic Affairs (CCEA) Note, the nodal officer's workshop held on 1st October, 2010 and the internal finance division of MHA. Thereafter, MHA issued the final PIM approval letters with fund allotment to States/UTs

The Project Implementation Reports (PIM Reports) evaluations carried out at MHA for all 35 States/UTs, based on recommendations of NCRB and Integrated Finance division of MHA, were approved by Empowered Committee.

Issue of guidelines for System Integrator Request for Proposal (SIRFP) preparation with respect to Networking and Data Centre - The Networking solution of CCTNS project shall be based on a Hybrid Model which will consist of State Wide Area Network (SWAN) operated by State/UT under SWAN scheme and Data network operated by Bharat Sanchar Nigam Limited (BSNL) which consists of Point to point leased lines, VPNoBB, WiMax, VSAT and MPLS technologies. BSNL shall be providing the Networking & Connectivity services along with Operations & Maintenance for all the locations implemented by BSNL in that State/UT. BSNL shall also provide connectivity on MPLS VPN network for aggregated bandwidth at each State/UT and StateData Centre(SDC) for the locations connected on VPNoBB, WiMax and VSAT network and also provide connectivity for SDGs (State Data Centre) at State Head quarters (SHQs) to the National Data Centre (NDC) of NCRB.

An addendum to the model RFP for selection of System Integrator (SI) was released in March, 2011 to include Vendor Neutrality and clarifications on the scope of work of System Integrator (SI) with respect to Networking and DataCentre and Evaluation Criteria.
